Valero Picks 2012

Valero picks are based on recent performance and historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the web site. Others to consider are based on other various factors, stats, etc.

J.B. Holmes — Holmes has been a up and down since his return from injury, however, his 8th place finish at his most recent start puts him on a trend coupled with 2 top 15 finishes at Valero makes him a decent pick.

Kevin Streelman— Streelman is on a bit of a trend in recent play which combines with his 2 top 20 finishes in 2 starts at the Valero.

Charley Hoffman — Hoffman is another player on a trend and is a bit of a horse for the course (or courses, as the case may be).

Fredrik Jacobson – Jacobson has finished in the top 5 in the past 3 years at the Valero, he hasn't played all that well of late, his play at Valero puts him on the list.

Kevin Na — Na has played well recently, with 2 top 10s and a 12th place finish in his last 3 starts.

Matt Kuchar — Kuchar could contend as he seemingly does week in and week out, however, after last week at Harbour Town he could be in for another drop off or let down. But as the highest ranked player in the field, it's tough not to put him on the list.

Boo Weekley – Weekley has bettered his finish for 3 successive starts of late, that's a good trend capped with a 6th last week at Harbour Town.

Harris English —English won a Nationwide event in his 3rd start on that tour, he lost in a playoff 2 starts later. He's missed 2 cuts in 10 events played on the PGATour this year and has 5 top 20s. English is 22 years old. He's going to win, just a matter of when.

Garth Mulroy – Mulroy is on a trend and has a 6th place finish 2 years ago at Valero.

Brendan Steele – Defending champion.
