John Deere picks are based on recent performance and historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the web site. Others to consider are based on other various factors, stats, trends, etc.

Steve Stricker – Stricker won this tournament 3 times in a row from 2009-2011. He finished 5th last year.

Zach Johnson – Johnson is the defending champion and finished 3rd in 2011 and 2nd in 2009.

Ryan Moore – Moore is on a trend with a top 10 finish in his previous start and he finished 8th at John Deere last year.

John Senden – Senden is another player on a trend and he finished 4th last year at this event.

Brendon de Jonge – de Jonge has 2 top 10 finishes at this tournament over the past 3 years played and he comes into the event on a slight trend.

Scott Stallings – Stallings has 2 top 10 finishes in his last 5 events played, he's trending and he finished 22nd at the John Deere in 2011.

K.J. Choi — Choi is on a trend, he finished 13th last year at this tourney. Choi seems to be a little under the radar as well.

Brendon Todd — Since Todd won in May on the Web.com Tour, he hasn't finished outside the top 20 in 4 events played..

Cameron Percy – Percy has back to back 30th place finishes coming into the John Deere and he finished 7th in 2011 after missing the cut in 2010. He did not participate last year.

Dong-Hwan Lee — Lee is one of the hottest players in the field with 2 top 10 finishes in his last 2 events played.

Morgan Hoffmann – Hoffmann has 2 top 10 finishes in his last 3 events played and a 23rd place finish in his most recent start.
