St. Jude picks are based on recent performance and historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the web site. Others to consider are based on other various factors, stats, trends, etc.

**Brandt Snedeker** – Snedeker has 2 top 10 finishes in his last 4 starts coming into the St. Jude tourney. Although his finishes in recent years at St. Jude have only been 15<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>, he's a better player now than he was then.

**Dustin Johnson** – Johnson is the defending champion. The question is, is he healthy enough to compete – kind of the same question as last year before he won this event.

**Ryan Palmer** – Palmer is on a trend and had a 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish at St. Jude's last year.

**Billy Horschel** – Horschel ran off 3 straight top 10 finishes, including a win before he missed a cut and finished 41<sup>st</sup> last week. He's on a slight trend and could pick off another win or top 10.

**Scott Stallings** – Stallings comes into this week with 2 consecutive top 10 finishes. He did finish 25<sup>th</sup> at St. Jude in 2011.

**Cameron Tringale** – Tringale is on a trend and finished 8<sup>th</sup> in his last St. Jude's start in 2011.

**John Merrick** – Merrick is another player on a trend and has trended better finishes at St. Jude's as well.

**Phil Mickelson** — Mickelson is tough to justify as a pick, but equally tough leaving him out. He can win just about anytime, anywhere.

**Ross Fisher** – Fisher has posted 2 top 10 finishes in his last 3 events played, including an 8<sup>th</sup> last week. However, it's his first time playing this event.

**Robert Karlsson** — Karlsson finished 2<sup>nd</sup> at St. Jude's in 2011 and 2010. He's on a trend coming into the event as well.
