WGC Bridgestone Championship Picks 2013

The WGC Bridgestone Championship picks are based on recent performance and historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the web site. Others to consider are based on other various factors, stats, trends, etc.

Tiger Woods – Woods is the favorite.

Steve Stricker – Stricker has back to back top 10 finishes in his last 2 events played and 3 top 10 finishes at Bridgestone over the past 4 years played.

Matt Kuchar – Kuchar is on a trend with a 2nd place finish at the Canadian last week and he's finished in the top 10 twice in the last 3 years played at Bridgestone.

Phil Mickelson – Mickelson is the hottest player on the planet. He has back to back wins coming into this event and finished 2nd in 2 of the 3 tourneys played prior to those wins.

Justin Rose – Rose finished 5th at this event last year and seems enough removed from his US Open win to start to play well again after a 13th place at Travelers and missed cut at the Open Championship.

Angel Cabrera — Cabrera finished in the top 15 in his last 3 events played coming into this tourney. Although it isn't a major, he might deem it worthy enough to play well, although his best finish in 3 years played over the last 5 is 4th in 2009.

Jim Furyk – Furyk is on a trend, he finished 9th at the Canadian last week and he has 2 top 10s in the last 3 years played at Bridgestone.

Adam Scott – Scott won here in 2011 and he's on a trend with a 3rd place finish at the Open Championship (his most recent event played).

Henrik Stenson – Stenson has 3 top 10 finishes in his last 3 events played.

Brandt Snedeker – Snedeker is coming off a win at the Canadian Open last week, sort of a bounce back from an 11th place finish at the Open Championship. He's been in the top 20 in all 4 of his most recent events played.
