The Masters picks are based on recent performance and historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the web site. Others to consider are based on other various factors, stats, trends, etc.

Jason Day – Day has 2 wins in his most recent 2 events played. Day finished 3^{rd} at The Masters in 2013 and 2^{nd} in 2011.

Bubba Watson — Watson has 2 top 2 finishes in his most recent 3 events played, including a win. Watson won The Masters in 2012 and in 2014.

Adam Scott – Scott has 3 top 2 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including 2 wins. Scott has 3 top 10 finishes at The Masters over the past 5 years, including a win in 2013.

Jordan Spieth – Spieth has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Spieth is also the defending champion and he finished 2nd at The Masters in 2014.

Rory McIlroy – McIlroy is on a trend with a 4th place finish in his most recent event played. McIlroy has 2 top 10 finishes at Augusta over the past 2 years.

Rickie Fowler – Fowler has 4 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Fowler finished 12th at The Masters last year and 5th in 2014.

Dustin Johnson – Johnson has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Johnson finished 6^{th} at Augusta last year.

Henrik Stenson – Stenson has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including 2nd last week at Shell. Stenson has 3 top 20 finishes at Augusta over the past 3 years.

Phil Mickelson – Mickelson has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Mickelson has won The Masters 3 times and he finished 2nd at Augusta last year.

Charl Schwartzel – Schwartzel is on a slight trend coming into The Masters to go with 3 top 20 finishes in his most recent 4 events played, including a win. Schwartzel won The Masters in 2011.
