Jordan Spieth – Spieth is the defending champion. Spieth is also on a trend coming into the tourney to go along with 2 top 5 finishes in his most recent 5 events played.

Henrik Stenson – Stenson finished 4th at Valspar last year and he has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 4 events played.

Ryan Moore – Moore is on a trend with a 10th place finish in his most recent start. Moore finished 5th at Valspar last year.

Jason Dufner – Dufner is on a trend coming into this event with an 11th place finish in his most recent event played. Dufner also has 4 top 25 finishes at this event over the past 4 years.

Danny Willett – Willett has 2 top 3 finishes in his most recent 3 events played, including a win and 3rd place at Doral last week.

Webb Simpson – Simpson has 3 top 20 finishes in his 3 events played this year. Simpson also 2 top 10 finishes at this event over the past 5 years.
