Tyrrell Hatton – Hatton has 4 top 10 finishes in his most recent 4 events played, including 2 wins in his most recent 2 events played. Hatton finished 23rd at HSBC last year.

Hideki Matsuyama – Matsuyama is on a trend coming into this event and he is the defending champion of this tourney.

Pat Perez – Perez has 5 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including 2 top 10s and a win.

Ross Fisher – Fisher has 2 second place finished in his most recent 2 events played. Fisher finished 6th at this event last year and he finished 3rd here in 2015.

Justin Rose – Rose has 4 top 10 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Rose finished 5th at HSBC in 2013.

Dustin Johnson – Johnson has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played and he is on a trend coming into this tourney. Johnson finished 5th here in 2015 and he won this event in 2013.

Tony Finau – Finau has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 4 events played.

Chez Reavie – Reavie has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 4 events played.

Patrick Reed – Reed is on a trend coming into this tourney and he's 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Reed finished 7th at HSBC in 2015.

Paul Casey – Casey has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including 3 top 10s. Casey finished 12th at this event last year.
