John Deere picks are based on recent performance and some historical performance at the event. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the website. Others to consider are based on factors such as stats, trends, etc.

Francesco Molinari – Molinari has 4 top 25 finishes in his most recent 4 events played, including 2 wins.

Steve Stricker – Stricker has 3 top 25 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Stricker has 3 top 15 finishes at John Deere over the past 5 years. Stricker also won this event 3 years in a row 2009-11.

Zach Johnson – Johnson has 2 top 20 finishes in his most recent 2 events played. Johnson has 4 top 5 finishes at John Deere over the past 5 years.

Bryson DeChambeau – DeChambeau is the defending champion and he comes into this event on a trend with 3 top 25 finishes in his most recent 3 events played, including a win.

Ryan Moore – Moore is another player on a trend coming into this tourney with a 13th in his most recent event played. Moore won this event in 2016.

Joaquin Niemann – Niemann has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played with 3 top 10 finishes and he's on a trend coming into John Deere.

Wesley Bryan – Bryan is on a trend coming into this tourney and he finished 3rd at this tourney last year and he finished 8th in 2016.

Chesson Hadley – Hadley finished 8th in his most recent event played, he's on a trend coming into this event and he finished 25th at John Deere last year.

Chris Kirk – Kirk has 3 top 15 finishes in his most recent 5 events played and he's another player on a trend coming into this event.

Johnson Wagner – Wagner has 4 made cuts in his most recent 5 events played. Wagner has 3 top 10 finishes at John Deere over the past 4 years.
