

WGC HSBC 2019 Picks

HSBC picks are based on recent performance. Picks can be verified by checking out the statistics page on the website. Others to consider are based on factors such as stats, trends, etc.

Rory McIlroy – McIlroy has 4 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win. McIlroy finished 4th at HSBC in 2016.

Justin Rose – Rose has 2 top 15 finishes in his most recent 3 events played. Rose finished 3rd at this event last year and he won this event in 2017.

Paul Casey – Casey has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win. Casey has 4 top 25 finishes at this tourney over the past 4 year. (2 top 15s)

Hideki Matsuyama – Matsuyama has 4 top 20 finishes in his most recent 5 events played (2 top 5s). Matsuyama won this tourney in 2016.

Xander Schauffele – Schauffele has 3 top 20 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Schauffele is the defending champion.

Tommy Fleetwood – Fleetwood has 4 top 25 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Fleetwood finished 7th at this tourney last year.

Charles Howell III – Howell has 3 top 20 finishes in his most recent 4 events played. Howell finished 15th at HSBC in 2017.

Sungjae Im – Im has 3 top 3 finishes in his most recent 5 events played, including a win.

Tony Finau – Finau has 3 top 10 finishes in his most recent 5 events played. Finau finished 2nd at this event last year and he finished 11th at HSBC in 2017.

Matt Wallace – Wallace has 4 top 15 finishes in his most recent 5 events played.
